About Boca Helping Hands......


The volunteers serve seven hot meals six days a week-Monday -Saturday from 11:30 to 12:30 to families and individuals that include the working poor, single parents, children, the elderly and homeless. A Family Night Dinner is served every Thursday evening from 4:30 to 6:00. Only families are admitted to the Thursday night dinners. The families also get to take home grocery bags of food staples to help meet their food needs. There is also entertainment (e.g., movies) for the children.



Blessings in a Backpack

For 40 weeks during the school year Boca Helping Hands partners with local congregations, organizations and Boca Raton Elementary Schools to help provide over 1,200 backpacks filled with six healthful non-perishable meals for a student. Volunteers pack backpacks and low-income children at five local elementary schools take them home on the weekends and return the empty backpacks on Monday. For many, this is their only food for the weekend.

Boca Helping Hands also has a Pantry Program, a Resource Center, Job Mentoring program, Children's Assistance programs and they provide Homeless Kits containing a meal, soap, shampoo, etc.
