Dear Boca Zontians,

March, 2020 is a significant month for us. We as a club are celebrating our 45th anniversary. We chartered as a club on March 3, 1975, with a Chartering Dinner on March 9,1975. We chartered with 29 members and the Charter President was Jackie Malone. The Zonta Club of Delray was our SOM club.

During our early years, some of our local service projects were focused on assisting with the needs of unwed mothers, cancer survivors, foster parents, food for the homeless, and literacy for children. Over time, our service activities have evolved to include assisting young women aging out of foster care, aiding victims of domestic violence, working to assist women in learning English as a second language, establishing an endowed scholarship for non-traditional-aged women students, participating in outreach to assist women in learning about breast and heart health, as well as obtaining free mammograms to help combat breast cancer, educating others about human trafficking, and helping to support efforts to assist survivors of sexual assault.

Further we have been active on both the district and international level. We regularly attend Area Meetings and District Conferences, as well as Zonta International Conventions. Our club, over the years, has had two members serve as District Governors, hosted Area meetings and District Conferences, as well as planning and hosting a Zonta International Convention.

Additionally, at the International level, we have had members serve on various Zonta International Committees, including chairing the Zonta International Credentials Committee at convention.

Throughout our history we have had members serve as Area Directors as well as positions on the District Board. Further, we have certificates of recognition and a Governor's Cup to recognize the accomplishments of our club over its history.

We have had a rich and storied history and look forward to continuing as a viable active club. Let us celebrate those successes!! As you can see on page 3, our Zonta International President has sent a letter of recognition and congratulations.

Also, in March, International Women's Day is celebrated on March 8th, which is a global day celebrating the historical, cultural, and political achievements of women. It is also a day of recognition of the support for taking action against gender inequality around the world. The theme for the 2020 International Women's Day is "I *am Generation Equality: Realizing Women's Rights"* and is aligned with the UN Women's new multigenerational campaign, Generation Equality, which marks the 25th anniversary of the Beijing Declaration and Platform for Action.

The emerging global consensus is that despite progress made, real change has been agonizingly slow for the majority of women and girls in the world. Today, not one single country can claim to have achieved gender equality. There are multiple obstacles that remain unchanged in law and culture. Women and girls continue to be undervalued, work more and earn less, and have fewer choices, as well as experiencing violence at home and in public places.

2020 represents an unmissable opportunity to mobilize global action to achieve gender equality and human rights for all women and girls.


