2022 Young Women In Public Affairs Recipient

Lena Kalandjian is an Armenian-American from Parkland, Florida who has a passion for fostering anti-violent communities. After co-founding her school's Students Against Violence Everywhere (SAVE) Promise Club in 2018, Lena implemented community-wide violence prevention and diversity education programs that impacted thousands of local students every year. Her club has been nationally recognized 8 times and awarded sev-

eral stipends and grants to continue its work. Lena also served two years on the National Youth Advisory Board of the non-profit gun violence prevention organization Sandy Hook Promise. Not only did she help organize and lead the Sandy Hook Promise's National Youth Summit, but she also worked with the Biden-Harris Presidential Transition Team, the National Center for School Safety, and TIME Magazine to elevate youth perspectives and spark positive community action.

In high school, Lena was Executive President of Student Government, Concertmaster of the Chamber Orchestra, a Varsity Track & Field and Basketball athlete, a Student Coalition Leader of the Cultural Intelligence Team, and Team Lead of the All-Women's Underwater Robotics team. Next year, Lena will be attending Vanderbilt University as Chancellor's Scholar to major in Human Organizational Development. She seeks to channel her experiences into building better institutions wherever her path takes her.

Zonta International Statement on the U.S. Supreme Court's overturning of Roe v. Wade

News of the U.S. Supreme Court's decision to overturn Roe v. Wade this week reached Zonta International as its members gathered from around the globe in Hamburg, Germany, to discuss the continued fight for the rights of women and girls globally.

As an organization that has been working towards gender equality for more than 100 years, Zonta International is committed to upholding and improving the legal and health status of women at the global and local levels through service and advocacy. This decision by the U.S. Supreme Court takes away the rights of women in the United States to legally access critical reproductive healthcare, including safe abortion services, even as the U.S. has the highest maternal mortality rate among industrialized countries. The impact of this action will be severe, especially for poor, rural, Black, Indigenous and LGBTQIA+ women.

In accordance with the Zonta International Statement on Women's Sexual and Reproductive Health, we urge our members in 62 countries around the world to advocate at the national level to ensure that all women and girls have access to the full range of reproductive health services. We cannot achieve gender equality for all women and girls if they do not have the basic rights to bodily autonomy.
